The GGHS has acquired former Rio Grande Southern Coach #256 that has long been a resident in Dolores. For the coach's preservation, that has been an advantage. The coach body has been up in the air and wasn't resting on the ground, so the wood framing is in quite good shape for a 120 year-old piece of equipment. Of course, how does one do a proper restoration without a set of trucks? The D&SNGR graciously donated a set of Colorado & Southern narrow gauge passenger trucks for use under the coach. Needless to say, they have seen better days and need much work to make them roadworthy. Philip Steffen, Larry LeRoi and Paul Bilger of the Southwest Woodworkers Guild have taken on the job of restoring #256, starting with the trucks. They began work during the first part of December 2000. Wood – white oak – has been donated from a company back east and should be arriving anytime. Frontier machine of Dolores, has committed to the necessary machine work – rebuilding the pedestals, turning the axles, re-babbitting the bearing inserts and anything else necessary.

It is intended that Coach #256 will be configured as a narrow gauge private car, there is nothing original left inside, and after restoration travel to guest railroads for special excursions much like GGHS #5 does.


MEMBERSHIP
